TRAINING EQUIPMENT

TREATS!

Ask your client if dog is allergic

Use their treats when possible

bring back up treats - variety

Lamb lung, Zukes chicken/
rabbit, dehydrated liver etc...



TRAINING EQUIPMENT

Leashes 4- 6 feet

Nylon - Synthetic leashes are cheap, lightweight, and easily washed, they can burn your hands if your dog lunges. Wearing gloves can help prevent the leash from slipping

Leather - Generally last a long time and will not burn your hands if your dog pulls, they're more expensive. Easier to grip onto in warm and cold weather and good for strong dogs



TRAINING EQUIPMENT

Leashes 4- 6 feet

Metal or Chain Leashes - If your dog is a chewer - metal or chain leashes will likely deter that, they're sometime heavy and cumbersome.

Gripper Leash - is made with cotton/polyester webbing with two rows of rubberized stitching that runs the entire length of the leash and handle.

Intended to increase ‘grip ability’ of leash.



TRAINING EQUIPMENT

Extendable Leashes

Extendable leashes - give your dog freedom to roam, they can reinforce the dog for pulling on leash consistently



TRAINING EQUIPMENT

Long Line / Long Leash

20 – 50 feet

- This line has sometimes has a handle or no handle (less ability to snag on things) or knots and is equipped with a quality clasp which attaches to the dogs' collar
- Used for distance training and gaining control for dogs who require more freedom
- Hold it at the length you want it to be and allow the rest to trail behind



TRAINING EQUIPMENT

Collars

Nylon Flat Collar - Clip

Nylon Flat Collar - Buckle

Safety tip - properly ensure the right fit : **two finger tight !**

if you can fit more than 2 fingers in between the collar and the pet - its too loose and could slip off!

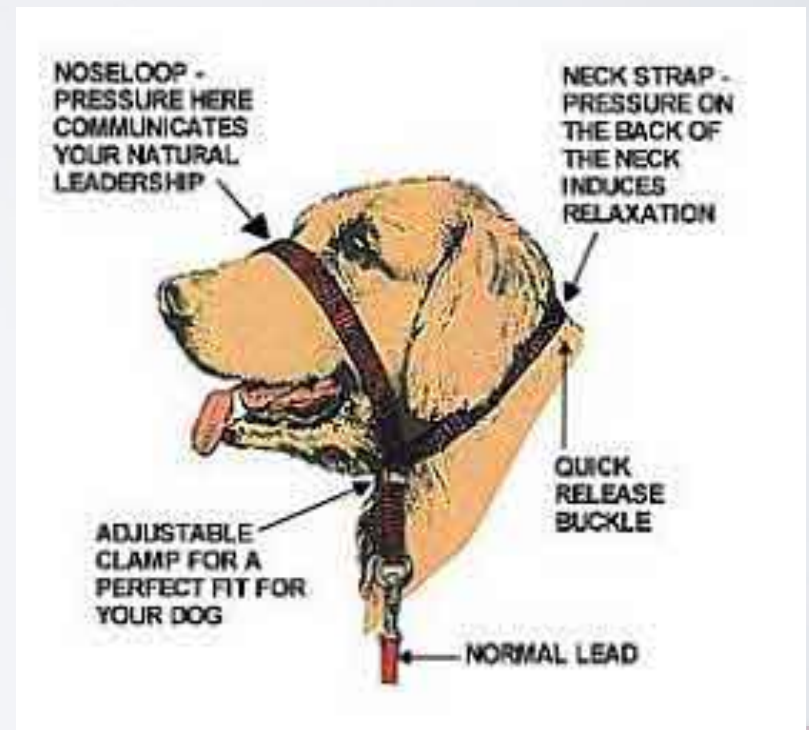
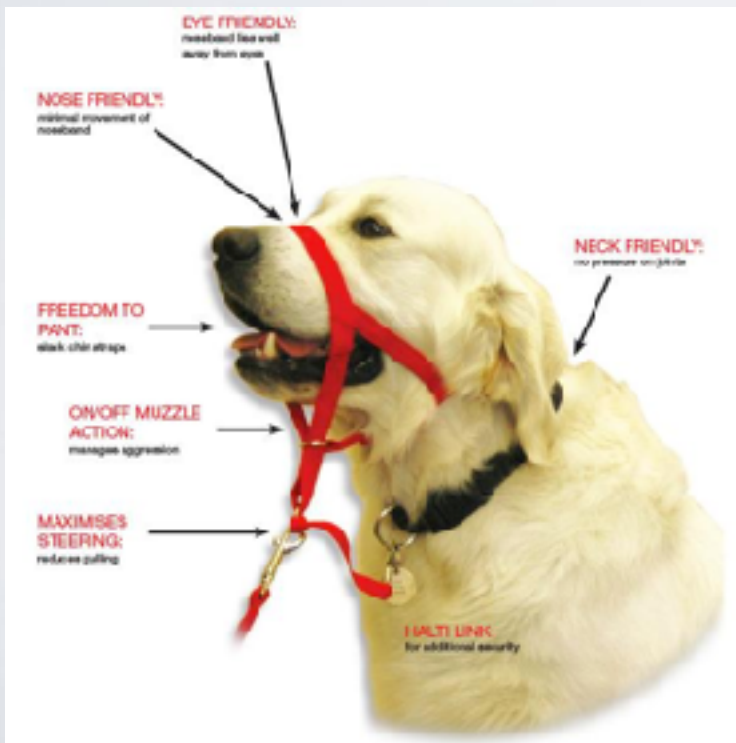

TRAINING EQUIPMENT

Crates and Barriers

Pet Barriers – Baby gate

Containment in a certain area or prevention of access to certain areas - make sure your dog doesn't learn to jump over – once they do – they will continue to do so!
Possible injuries can occur when jumping over gate or attempts to jump over



TRAINING EQUIPMENT

Crates and Barriers

Exercise Pen – X-pen

Used for housetraining puppies and containment of dogs – dogs are best not left unattended – dogs can learn to climb and jump out of exercise pens

Available in varied sizes and heights

Also lids for pens are available



TRAINING EQUIPMENT

House Training Aids

Doggie litter box – used for smaller breeds of dogs typically and great for puppies



TRAINING EQUIPMENT

House Training Aids

Pee Pads - used often – encourage clients to take away as soon as possible



TRAINING EQUIPMENT

House Training Aids

Potty Pads / Pee Pads

Used to help dogs mainly puppies to eliminate in one place inside the home.

Most commonly used with very small dogs, people who are unable to get outside easily due to health issues or living in a high rise and people who work such long hours that their dog can't reasonably be expected to hold it and wait to go outside.

Recommend indoor potty training only for owners whose dogs will permanently be trained to go indoors, since it can be difficult to train your dog to go outside once he's been taught that its ok to go indoors

Newspaper - cheap and always available



TRAINING EQUIPMENT

House Training Aids

Pee Pads vs. Newspapers

If you choose to use newspapers or potty pads, you may increase your chances of success by putting them in a tray with a low edge rather than just putting them directly on the floor.

This will prevent them from moving and will make the distinction between the floor and the potty area clearer for Fido.

Using a tray can also help to prevent the common problem of Fido standing with his front paws on the paper, thinking he's being a good boy, while his back end is off the paper making a mess on the floor.

TRAINING EQUIPMENT

House Training Aids

Urine Post

Housetraining aid to encourage the dog to pee in one area - treated with a pheromone scent that encourages your dog to eliminate in a specific part of your yard.

Non toxic pheromone.



TRAINING EQUIPMENT

House Training Aids

Dog Litter Box / Potty Park / Backyard in a box

Small Potty Park is for toy breeder and smaller dogs up to 35 lbs. Small: 26" long x 20" wide x 4 1/2" tall, 10lbs.

Large Potty Park medium to large sized dogs and little ones who would like a little more space. Large: 32" long x 26" wide x 7" tall, 16lbs.

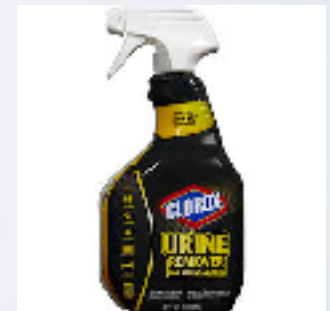

TRAINING EQUIPMENT

Pheromone Sprays

Comfort Zone and D.A.P. -Dog Appeasing Pheromone

What is D.A.P.? - D.A.P. is a synthetic copy of a dog's naturally occurring appeasing pheromones from the lactating female.



TRAINING EQUIPMENT

Pheromone Sprays

Developed for pet owners by veterinarians, D.A.P. controls/addresses attachment problems, and provides reassurance and comfort to the dog, discouraging stress related destructive behaviour.

How can D.A.P. calm dogs in stressful situations? - Clinical studies show a 72 percent reduction in anxiety related destructive behaviour over a four week-use. D.A.P. can be used in stressful situations, such as separation and adjusting to new homes, pets and people.



TRAINING EQUIPMENT

Pheromone Sprays

How is D.A.P. used? –

- D.A.P. is an easy-to-use "plug-in" diffuser that consists of an electrical plug-in unit and disposable (30-day) bottle that will deliver the pheromone 24 hours a day.

It continuously releases the active ingredient into the dog's environment and allows trouble-free treatment in a 650-square-foot area for approximately four weeks.

TRAINING EQUIPMENT

Muzzles

A dog muzzle is a device used for two main purposes—to train service dogs and dogs owned as pets and to protect owners and dog trainers when working with stray, aggressive or injured dogs.

Types of muzzles

- Soft -
 - Nylon
- Hard - basket type
 - Plastic
 - Metal

TRAINING EQUIPMENT

Soft Muzzles

These are more restrictive than a basket muzzle as they are snug around the dogs mouth and hold it more closed - dogs can still sometimes nip with these on.

Handler beware!

Typically made of Nylon



TRAINING EQUIPMENT

Hard - Basket Muzzles

These are more used for training as you can see more body language with less restraint

Dogs are also able to eat and drink while wearing this type.

These hurt when pressed or pushed on a person - handler beware!

Typically made of hard plastic or metal or leather.
